Waste, something that has always been seen as a problem that needed to be solved, a subject of little importance, the last and least of a municipality's problems.

Today a change of direction is a necessity and an obligation, a change towards a new way of considering waste – no longer as a problem but rather as a resource. Waste is the raw material that can have a second life if separated and recycled correctly. Plastic, glass, metals, paper that we must not throw away, materials that must not be incinerated. The more we separate, the less we waste, and the more we save.

#### **IMPORTANT ADVICE:**

Municipal administrator warns the citizenry that will strengthen its controls and monitoring of the collection, so that following the procedures and timetable described in this leaflet. Therefore, the City will make use of the video surveillance system and controls carried out by the Municipal Police Force to prevent the abandonment of waste on the territory. Violators will be punished with the penalties provided by law.

MONDAY	ORGANIC	<ul> <li>kitchen waste, left-over food</li> <li>vegetable and fruit waste</li> <li>coffee grounds, tea bags</li> <li>pet litter, cut flowers and house plants</li> <li>stale bread, egg shells</li> <li>extinguished fireplace ash</li> <li>q-tips/cotton swabs with paper sticks, kleenex/ tissues, greasy or dirty white (not colored) napkins</li> <li>pizza cartons, only the dirty or greasy part</li> <li>baking paper</li> <li>matches and small objects in untreated wood</li> <li>stoppers and other items made of cork</li> <li>pencils and crayons without tires and metals</li> </ul>
	GLASS	<ul> <li>bottles, glass jars for beverages, sauces, dressings, preserves, baby food, cosmetics, medicine etc.</li> <li>glass dishes: plates, glasses, bowls, pans, trays.</li> <li>No Pyrex, no crystal, no pottery.</li> </ul>
TUESDAY	PAPER - CARDBOARD	<ul> <li>beverage cartons (milk, fruit juice, wine, etc.)</li> <li>newspapers, magazines, books</li> <li>exercise books, photocopies and other papers</li> <li>food boxes, cardboard packaging</li> </ul>

THURSDAY	PLASTIC - METAL	<ul> <li>packaging with the PE, PET, PVC, PS and PP symbols</li> <li>polystyrene packaging</li> <li>water and beverage bottles</li> <li>detergent and shampoo bottles</li> <li>shaped containers (eggs boxes), food containers</li> <li>plastic shopping bags</li> <li>plastic plates and cups</li> <li>steel and aluminum jars, cans and tubes for sauces, dressings, preserves, tuna fish, peeled tomatoes, meat, cosmetics, medicine etc.</li> <li>spray cans: deodorant, hairspray etc.</li> <li>steel and aluminum lids and caps, closing film for beverages, dressings, yogurt etc.</li> <li>aluminum foil, pans and trays, e.g. Domopak and Cuki , chocolate wrappers etc.</li> </ul>
FRIDAY	UNDIFFERENTIATED (NON-RECYCLABLE SOLID WAST)	<ul> <li>rubber, toys</li> <li>CDs, audio and video cassettes</li> <li>plastic cutlery</li> <li>carbon, greaseproof and plasticized paper</li> <li>ceramic shards, traditional light bulbs</li> <li>sanitary towels, pads and babies' nappies</li> <li>cosmetics, dirty rags, plastic coffee pods, cigarette ends</li> <li>vacuum dusts</li> </ul>

- ✓ **BATTERIES** disposal in special street containers or at waste disposal site.
- ✓ OVERSIZE ITEMS/WOOD/IRON/GLASS CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS/GREEN (GARDEN) WASTE/"RAEE" - ELECTRICAL AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT - at waste disposal site.
- ✓ **MEDICINES** in special containers, which can be found at pharmacies and medical facilities.
- ✓ **USED CLOTHES AND SHOES** in the specific street containers.
